EU SEE is the landmark project [funded by the European Union](#) for monitoring deteriorations and improvements in the environment for civil space across 86 countries in Africa, the Middle East, Asia and the Pacific, the Americas and the Caribbean.

EU SEE has been established in response to the authoritarian pushback of the last decade and the increasing restrictions on the enabling environment for civil society.

EU SEE is coordinated by an international consortium of CSOs, including [Hivos](#) (lead), [CIVICUS](#), [Democracy Reporting International](#), the [European Partnership for Democracy](#), [Forus](#), [Transparency International](#), and network members in each country.
